NOTES :

The texture of the fruit is round and elegant. It has ripeness but balanced by the acidity which is coming from a high diurnal shift. This is the main reason it would take me to Washington. Riper than Bordeaux, but more restraint than Napa. The herbaceous nature of Cabernet shows through, but the fruit is more prominent, helping to differentiate from Old-World examples.
