

TASTING PACK WINE **#144**

TASTING NOTES BY: MASTER SOMMELIER CHRITOPHER BATES

The wine is deep ruby with purple hue with lots of black fruit on the nose -ripe black cherry, black berry. Rustic woodsy characteristic to the wine with notes of white pepper, allspice, slight minerality and notes of dark chocolate. There is no evidence of new oak. There is a zippy acidity and a fresh and juicy finish.

TASTING NOTES BY: ADVANCED SOMMELIER JOSHUA CARLSEN

Vibrant purple with moderate viscosity. The palate is edgy with just ripe brambly berry fruit - blackberry, raspberry, black cherry. Violets and white pepper notes are distinct, with loamy earth and a slight chalky note. No evidence of new oak, but there is a hint of Indian spices.

NOTES :

Blaufränkisch can take on many forms, but this example is 'classic' in that it does not see new oak, and has a restrained palate. I always find notes of violets and white/black pepper in Blaufränkisch, along with brambly berry notes. It can be confused with Gamay, but has a stronger emphasis on earthy notes as compared to the hard stone minerality as well as a focus on dark fruit and not red fruits of Cru Beaujolais. Markus Altenburger is notable for being very hands-off in the winery, eschewing SO2 until bottling, for example, but manages to produce wines that do not present as 'natural'.
